The key mandate of ATSEA-2 is to support the implementation of the ATS Strategic Action Program (SAP), focusing on: strengthening regional governance, promoting sustainable fisheries, restoring degraded habitats, reducing pollution from land-based and marine sources, protecting important marine species and adapting to the impacts of climate change.
